



International Nuclear Safeguards Policy

One-Week Tuition-Free Intensive Course in Monterey and Paid Summer Internships at Lawrence Livermore National Lab


Middlebury Institute of International Studies at Monterey (MIIS) and Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory (LLNL), in support of the U.S. Department of Energy National Nuclear Security Administration's Next Generation Safeguards Initiative, are pleased to announce a one-week, tuition-free, intensive course on international nuclear safeguards policy and up to six paid summer internships.

The International Nuclear Safeguards Policy and Information Analysis Course will be held in Monterey from June 1-5, 2020. The course is tuition free and open to all nationalities. Some stipends will be available to non-local applicants to partially cover transportation and housing costs. Course applicants who are U.S. citizens may also apply for a ten-week paid internship (June 8 to August 14, 2020) at LLNL in Livermore. The internships pay \$6,000 total which is paid in two installments of \$3,000. Successful completion of the course is a prerequisite for the internships.

COURSE TOPICS INCLUDE

- The role of the IAEA and international safeguards in the nuclear nonproliferation regime
- Concepts, objectives, evolution and history of international nuclear safeguards
- State-level safeguards analysis
- Case-study analyses of safeguards challenges
- Introduction to safeguards inspection, material accounting, containment, and surveillance
- Open-source information collection and analysis
- Effectiveness and limitations of safeguards
- Future development of safeguards

Applicants must be a currently enrolled graduate student or a young professional with an interest in nuclear nonproliferation/safeguards. We are especially interested in applicants who demonstrate how a deeper understanding of international safeguards policy will aid their professional pursuits. To be eligible for LLNL internships, applicants must be U.S. citizens. Qualified applicants for internships will be interviewed by a selection panel.
