## Strategy for Biden on DPRK

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## What's the overall objective – the end game?

• DPRK - it's more than just ending "hostile policy"

• U.S. – it's more than denuclearization

- DPRK ??
  - Bob Carlin's view
- U.S. Hecker view
  - Prevent aggression against U.S. and allies
  - Support ROK to achieve its goals on peninsula
  - Prevent export of WMD, cyber crimes
  - Respect for human rights
  - Common ground with China but avoid grater DPRK reliance on China

## **DPRK** nuclear program in support of its objectives

- Dual track strategy
  - Diplomacy plus
  - Nuclearization building a nuclear deterrent
- Concurrent pursuit
  - Higher priority of Diplomacy or Nuclear depends on:
    - External factors mostly U.S.
    - Technical and military progress
    - Domestic factors
- Keep a hedge with nuclear pursuit
  - U.S. response requires technically informed risk/benefit analysis

## Suggested Biden strategy for U.S.

- Revisit overall objectives statement of principles
- Adopt a new dual track strategy
  - Diplomacy <u>plus</u>
  - Deterrence/dissuasion
- Diplomacy
  - Stress halt, roll back & eliminate nuclear weapons
  - Offer cooperative conversion military to peaceful
  - Negotiate security assurances requested by DPRK
  - Use sanctions <u>relief</u> as diplomatic tool
- Deterrence/dissuasion
  - U.S. has credible deterrent no change in US nukes needed
  - Extended deterrence has become less credible
  - Need to strengthen alliance and conventional forces to credibly dissuade DPRK aggressive actions
